# What We've Been Up To

The Next Step Program is a six-month Leadership Mentoring and Career Development Plan for Veterans, conducted through bi-weekly Zoom workshops. Led by expert Gabriella Leverence, the program covers leadership development, academic/career exploration, and professional growth. Workshops address effective communication, teamwork, goal setting, and time management. The Academic/Career Exploration segment guides Veterans through self-assessment, interest mapping, career research, networking, and mentorship. **Professional Development** workshops focus on resume writing, interview skills, and personal branding. Local professionals and leaders engage as guest speakers while mentoring pairs students with local mentors for guidance. IIn a poignant op-ed published in the Portland Press Herald of Maine, Adeline Hatfield, our Health Policy Intern at Military Veterans of America, addresses the pressing issue of Veteran mental health. Highlighting a tragic incident following a Senate hearing, Hatfield advocates for the effectiveness of 988 +1 as a solution to the complex problem of Veteran suicides. Despite the hotline's success, Hatfield highlights critical challenges, including well-trained responders, wait times, and staffing issues. She emphasizes the need for a statefocused approach, citing varied state legislations supporting 988. Hatfield calls for community-based evaluation and Veteran involvement in solutions and stresses that 988 +1 must evolve into a reliable and standardized resource for Veterans in need.

Key points emerged in our recent meeting with Rep Mike Levin (CA) on the Transition Assistance Program (TAP). Different services vary in TAP execution, with Ft. Liberty and Naval Norfolk excelling due to civilian staff with prior transitions. Camp Lejeune relies on Unit Transition Coordinators but faces challenges, with only 25% meeting deadlines. Oversight responsibility differs, with Camp Lejeune under the OIG and Ft. Liberty having limited oversight. Data transparency and reporting to Congress need improvement. In-class dynamics vary, with Camp Lejeune prioritizing in-person sessions while Ft. Liberty offers online options. There's a suggestion to enhance pre-class preparation and allocate more time to critical topics like homelessness and practical issues. We will continue to monitor the state of TAP and aid its improvement in the future.



FACT: From 2010 to 2020, Veteran homelessness decreased by over 55 percent. However, in January 2022, there were still over 30,000 Veterans experiencing homelessness.
